

**ORDINANCE NO. 35-2005**

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING THE  
REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF  
SPRING LAKE, COUNTY OF MONMOUTH, STATE OF  
NEW JERSEY, CREATING NEW CHAPTER XIX, "STORMWATER  
MANAGEMENT AND NONPOINT POLLUTION CONTROL"  
SECTION 1.**

**BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF  
SPRING LAKE, IN THE COUNTY OF MONMOUTH, AND STATE OF NEW  
JERSEY, AS FOLLOWS:**

**SECTION 1. CHAPTER 19, SUBSECTION 1      PURPOSE**

An Ordinance to amend requirements for the proper handling of yard waste in the Borough of Spring Lake, so as to protect public health, safety and welfare, and to prescribe penalties for the failure to comply.

**SECTION 2. CHAPTER 19, SUBSECTION 1.1      DEFINITIONS**

- a. Person - any individual, corporation, company, partnership, firm, association or political subdivision of this State subject to municipal jurisdiction.
- b. Street - means any street, avenue, boulevard, road, parkway, viaduct, drive or other way, which is an existing State, County or Municipal roadway and includes the land between the street lines, whether improved or unimproved, and may comprise pavement, shoulder, gutters, curbs, sidewalks, parking areas and other areas within the street lines.

**SECTION 3. CHAPTER 19, SUBSECTION 1.2 PROHIBITED CONDUCT**

The owner or occupant of any property, or any employee or contractor of such owner or occupant engaged to provide lawn care or landscaping services, shall not sweep, rake, blow or otherwise place yard waste in the street.

In accordance with existing State regulations effective upon the final passage of this Ordinance, no person shall be permitted to place bagged, boxed, loose or otherwise, any grass clippings at the Recycling Center. Further, grass clippings will not be allowed to be placed in the street, but must be disposed of by the home owner.

If yard waste is placed in the street, the party responsible for placement of yard waste must remove the yard waste from the street or said property shall be deemed in violation.

#### **SECTION 4. CHAPTER 19, SUBSECTION 1.4, ENFORCEMENT**

The provisions of this Ordinance shall be enforced by the Police Department.

#### **SECTION 5. CHAPTER 19, SUBSECTION 1.5, VIOLATIONS AND PENALTIES**

Any person(s) who is found to be in violation of the provisions of the Ordinance shall be subject to a fine not to exceed Two Hundred (\$200.00) Dollars.

#### **SECTION 6. SEVERABILITY**

Each section, subsection, sentence, clause and phrase of this Ordinance is declared to be an independent section, subsection, sentence, clause and phrase, and the finding or holding of any such portion of the Ordinance to be unconstitutional, void, or ineffective for any cause, or reason, shall not affect any other portion of this Ordinance.

**SECTION 7.**

**EFFECTIVE DATE**


This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its final passage and publication as required by law.
